1. Main Office in Robbinsville, New Jersey-Services All of New Jersey
2. Call Hotline-1-877-652-7624
3. Cannot Be Denied Services/Absent Insurance-NO COST TO PARENT
4. Register Call By Giving Demographic Information
5. Then a 6 Digit ID Number will be Given
6. Then Call transferred to a Care Coordinator
7. Care Coordinator will give a series of Triage Questions (Emergency Protocol Over Phone)
 - A. Describe Situation of Concern-Discuss Guidance Feedback and Student Report
 - B. Questions will relate to Behavior, Harm to Self, Running Away, etc.
8. Answers to Questions, can Warrant Mobile Response to the Home and/or Choice Location within the hour if situation appears at a certain crisis level
9. Answer to Questions, may not warrant Mobile Response, but a Needs Assessment in place of...due to non-crisis status. Situation may be problematic, but not in a state of crisis.
 - A. Care Coordinator will offer 3 choice agencies to come out within in a 2 week time span to do a face to face interview and gather additional information. The chosen agency has 72 hours to contact the family.

Eva's Village will continue operating its halfway houses and shelters, as well as outreach programs for those struggling with addiction and mental health issues.

In lieu of the state's call to limit group gatherings and practice social distancing, the non-profit has suspended outpatient services and on-site programs at its Recovery Community Center. But, counselors and peer recovery mentors will still be available by phone to clients. Eva's Village has also set up a hotline for those seeking recovery support.

The Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) is a special federal and state tax benefit for individuals and families with earned income – whether it's full-time, part-time or self-employment. This tax credit may reduce the amount of taxes you owe, or provide you with a refund, even if you don't owe any taxes. Income, age and the number of qualifying children determine the amount of the credit, but you may receive a federal credit and NJ state credit. Workers without children also may qualify.
